
### 1. **Forbes: The Worst (And Best) States for Healthcare, Ranked**

- [2024 report](#): Indiana ranks 24<sup>th</sup> out of 50 states in health care costs
- [2023 report](#): Indiana ranks 11<sup>th</sup> highest in health care costs

**Takeaway:** Indiana improved its ranking by 13 spots in just one year.

### 2. [KFF: Average family premiums for employer-based health insurance](#)

**Takeaway:** Since 2020, Indiana has ranked at or below the national average in health insurance premiums.



### 3. **WalletHub**

- [WalletHub 2025](#) – Indiana ranks 8<sup>th</sup> best for health care costs
- [WalletHub 2024](#) – Indiana ranks 10<sup>th</sup> best for health care costs
- [WalletHub 2023](#) – Indiana ranks 11<sup>th</sup> best for health care costs
- [WalletHub 2022](#) – Indiana ranks 14<sup>th</sup> best for health care costs
- [WalletHub 2021](#) – Indiana ranks 15<sup>th</sup> best for health care costs

**Takeaway:** Since 2021, Indiana has improved from the 15<sup>th</sup> best state for health care costs to the 8<sup>th</sup> best state for health care costs.

### 4. **RAND**

- RAND 5.1: Indiana ranks 9<sup>th</sup> highest in hospital prices
- RAND 5: Indiana ranks 8<sup>th</sup> highest in hospital prices
- RAND 4: Indiana ranks 7<sup>th</sup> highest in hospital prices
- RAND 3: Indiana ranks 6<sup>th</sup> highest in hospital prices
- RAND 2: Indiana ranks highest in the nation in hospital prices
- RAND 1: Focused only on Indiana; did not include state rankings

**Takeaway:** Although IHA does not agree with the RAND methodology, the RAND studies demonstrate that Indiana hospitals have successfully lowered health care costs and prices are trending in the right direction.
