

The Nursing Now is an International Campaign to improve health globally by raising the status and profile of Nurses and Midwives, the same was launched in 2018 builds on years of advocacy by Nursing Professional Groups.



In India 'Nursing Now' Campaign was launched during International Conference on "Nurses and Midwives for Universal Health Coverage" (UHC) hosted by Indian Nursing Council endorsed by International Council of Nurses (ICN) from 29<sup>th</sup> November, 2018 to 1<sup>st</sup> December, 2018 by

Nursing Now, a three-year global campaign (2018-2020), run in collaboration with the World Health Organization (WHO) and the International Council of Nurses (ICN) aims to improve health by raising the profile and status of nursing professionals worldwide.

**Her Royal Highness of the Duchess of Cambridge is the PATRON of the ‘Nursing Now’ Campaign.**

The campaign is co-chaired by Lord Nigel Crisp, co-chair of the UK All-Party Parliamentary Group on Global Health (APPG), and Professor Sheila Tlou, Co-Chair of the Global HIV Prevention Coalition.

‘Nursing Now’ seeks to empower nurses to take their place at the heart of tackling 21st Century health challenges and maximize their contribution to achieve Universal Health Coverage.

The campaign will focus on five core areas: ensuring that nurses and midwives have a more prominent voice in health policy-making; encouraging greater investment in the nursing workforce; recruiting more nurses into leadership positions; conducting research that helps determine where nurses can have the greatest impact; and sharing of best nursing practices.

Year 2020 has been declared by the World Health Organisation as the “Year of the Nurses and the Midwives”. 2020 celebrate the 200<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Birth of Florence Nightingale, Nurse Innovation reformer and leader of improved Health Care.
