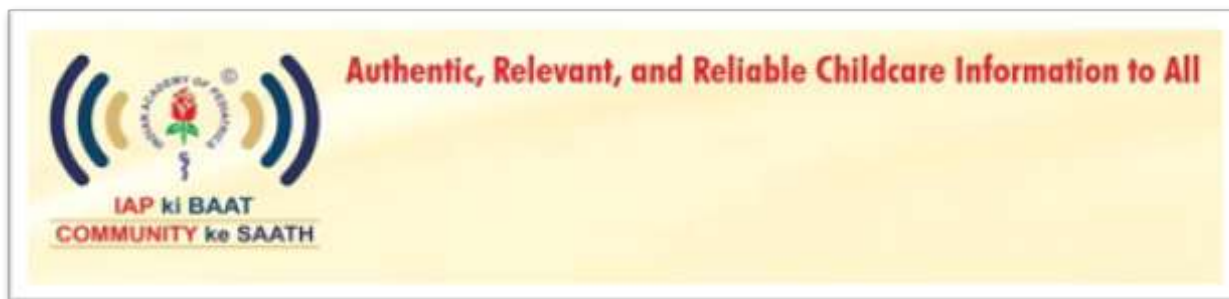

Agenda 3: Confirmation of the Minutes of the Annual General Body Meeting Held on 21st February 2023 at Gandhinagar, Gujarat

President Dr. G.V. Basavaraja directed Dr. Yogesh N. Parikh, Secretary General, to proceed with agenda no.3 to read and confirm the Minutes of the Annual General Body Meeting Held on 21st February 2023 at Gandhinagar, Gujarat.

The Secretary General, Dr. Yogesh N Parikh, presented the minutes of the Annual General Body Meeting held on 21st February 2023 in Gandhinagar, Gujarat, for confirmation. He informed the members that the e-copy of the Annual Report had already been circulated to all members, and hard copies were distributed to those present at the meeting.

The President, Dr. G.V. Basavaraja, requested the members to review the minutes of the previous Annual General Body Meeting, which were listed on pages 13 to 22 of the Annual Report. He then opened the floor for any discussion or concerns regarding the minutes.

Discussion and Resolution:

The minutes were approved as presented since no concerns or objections were raised. This approval was proposed by Dr. Jeetendra Gavhane and seconded by Dr. Renu Boralkar.

AGENDA NO 4: BUSINESS ARISING OUT OF THE MINUTES

The President Dr. G.V. Basavaraja proceeded to agenda no.4 and invited the August assembly to discuss any business arising from the confirmed minutes.

Dr. Nandeesh requested the chair to clarify whether any standard procedure exists for conducting the Annual General Body Meeting. President Dr. G.V. Basavaraja responded that there is no prescribed standard; the current method follows a long-standing tradition.

Dr. Nandeesh then asked the chair to allow the immediate past president to address queries related to the 'Annual Report of the Society,' as it reflects the performance of the previous Executive Board, led by the immediate past president. He explained that, as the current president, he was the president-elect last year and, therefore, not involved in last year's affairs. Similarly, the present treasurer is new, but the balance sheet presented is for April 2022 to March 2023, a period during which he was not officially in office.

In response, Dr. G.V. Basavaraja stated that once he assumed the role of president, it became his responsibility and duty to address any queries, and he would fulfill this function. The General Body unanimously appreciated Dr. G.V. Basavaraja's decision.

Followingly the discussions were conducted as follows:**1. Kailash Darshan Property:**

Dr. Dhananjay Shah reiterated his suggestion from the last General Body Meeting regarding the sale of the Kailash Darshan property. He emphasized that the property exceeded IAP's requirements and warned that its value may decline over time. He urged the chair to expedite the sale and inquired about the current status of the Finance Committee's review on this matter. Additionally, he had previously suggested selling the 4th floor of the Kamadhenu Business Bay property to generate funds and requested an update on the actions taken regarding this proposal.

Dr. G.V. Basavaraja, President, responded that the Finance Committee has recommended not to sell the Kailash Darshan property at this time. He assured the assembly that the newly formed Finance Committee would revisit the matter and subsequently brought to the Executive Board for further consideration. Regarding the Kamadhenu Business Bay property, he informed that the unused floor is planned to be renovated for use in IAP administrative activities.

Dr. Jeetendra Gavhane opposed the suggestion to sell the Kailash Darshan property, pointing out that it has a high market value with the potential for further appreciation, especially if it undergoes redevelopment. He recommended that IAP retain the property for a longer period.

2. Timely Sharing of GBM Minutes:

Dr. M.P. Jain raised concerns about the delay in distributing the minutes of the General Body Meeting, which were shared towards the end of the year. He suggested that the minutes be circulated within 30 days after the meeting to allow members to recall and review the discussions more effectively.

Resolution:

- Dr. G.V. Basavaraja** resolved that all matters concerning Society properties, including the Kailash Darshan property, will be handled in accordance with the Finance Committee's recommendations and the established standard procedures for managing the sale of Society properties.
- He further resolved that the Executive Board will adhere to the standard procedures recommended by the SOP Committee, ensuring that the minutes of the General Body Meeting are shared with members within one month of the meeting's conclusion.

AGENDA NO 5: CONSIDERATION AND ADOPTION OF ANNUAL REPORT OF THE SOCIETY

President Dr. G.V. Basavaraja directed Dr. Yogesh N. Parikh, Secretary General, to proceed with agenda no.5 to request the house to consider and adopt the annual report of the Society.

Secretary General Dr. Yogesh N Parikh informed members that the annual report for the year 2023 was circulated to all members on 19th December 2023, and the report spans pages 23 to 37. He further opened the house for discussion.

Discussions and Resolutions:**1. Inclusion of Ethics Committee:**

Discussion: Dr. Harish Pemde proposed that the details of the 'Ethics Committee' be included in the descriptions of various committees in the annual report.

Resolution: President Dr.G.V.Basavaraja resolved to include the 'Ethics Committee' details in the annual report.

2. Correction of Complimentary Feeding Day:

Discussion: Dr.R.Somasekhar recommended correcting the date of 'Complimentary Feeding Day' from the existing date in November to June 6th.

Resolution: President Dr. G.V. Basavaraja resolved to correct the date of 'Complimentary Feeding Day' to June 6th in all relevant documents and communications.

3. Inclusion of Financial Details in the Annual Report:

Discussion: Dr. M. P. Jain suggested including the Income Tax Return details, the status of TDS and income tax demands, and updates on ongoing tax cases in the annual report. He also pointed out the absence of information on profits received from Noida Pedicon-2022 and raised concerns regarding expenses during IPA Pedicon.

Resolution: President Dr. G.V. Basavaraja resolved that the annual report will include detailed financial information, including ITR filings, TDS status, income tax demands, and updates on ongoing tax cases. Additionally, profits from Noida Pedicon-2022 and other relevant financial matters will be duly incorporated. Matters related to Pedicon conducted in Hyderabad (2016), Noida (2022), and Gandhinagar (2023) will be referred to the Finance Committee for detailed review and recommendations.

4. Expansion of Workshops Under Presidential Action Plan:

Discussion: Dr. Nandeesh expressed concern about the limited number of IAP Presidential Action Plan Modules conducted, specifically noting that only 5 out of the 13 planned modules were held less than 7 times, including the 'Genetics and Rare Disease Workshop,' which was conducted only twice. He questioned the rationale behind conducting such a minimal number of workshops, especially when many branches are still awaiting academic training. Dr. Nandeesh further suggested expanding the number of workshops under the IAP Presidential Action Plan 2023, recommending that a minimum of 15 workshops per module be conducted, with equal distribution across all 5 zones.

Resolution: President Dr. G.V. Basavaraja resolved to expand the number of workshops under the IAP Presidential Action Plan-2024 to a minimum of 15 per module, ensuring equal distribution across all zones.

5. Request for CPR Mannequins:

Discussion: Dr. Prashant Kariya requested 3 to 4 CPR mannequins for the IAP Surat Branch. Dr. Anil Vincent also requested mannequins for Kerala state, and Dr. Annamalai Vijayraghavan made a similar request from Chennai.

Resolution: President Dr. G.V. Basavaraja resolved that the distribution of CPR mannequins will be prioritized based on availability. Members requesting mannequins are advised to submit their requests via email for consideration.

6. Reduction of Bank Accounts and Conduct of Executive Board Meetings:

Discussion: Dr. Ajay Kumar Gupta suggested reducing the number of bank accounts from 16 and proposed conducting at least two Executive Board meetings during Zonal Pedicons.

Resolution: President Dr. G.V. Basavaraja resolved to review and possibly reduce the number of bank accounts operated by IAP. Additionally, the feasibility of conducting Executive Board meetings during zonal Pedicon will be explored.

7. Alignment of Adolescent Week Celebration:

Discussion: Dr. Vineet Saxena proposed aligning the 'Adolescent Week Celebration' with WHO guidelines, suggesting it be held in March rather than November 8th.

Resolution: President Dr. G.V. Basavaraja resolved to align the 'Adolescent Week Celebration' with WHO guidelines after a thorough review.

8. Inclusion of Award Details in the Annual Report:

Discussion: Dr. Shivaprakash Sosale requested that details of various awards given to different district/city branches and state branches be included in the annual report for better record-keeping.

Resolution: President Dr. G.V. Basavaraja resolved to include detailed records of awards conferred upon District/City and State branches in the annual report.

9. Medico-Legal Celebration Day:

Discussion: Dr. Hemant Gangolia inquired about the initiation year for Medico-Legal Celebration Day, to which President Dr. G.V. Basavaraja confirmed it would begin this year.

Resolution: President Dr. G.V. Basavaraja resolved to officially recognize and include Medico-Legal Celebration Day in the IAP calendar starting this year.

10. Addressing TDS and Financial Queries:

Discussion: Dr. Ramesh Goyal raised queries related to TDS and sought clarifications on how to address these issues. He also suggested including details of FIAP awardees, specifying their respective branches and states, in the annual report. Additionally, he recommended that all financial queries be discussed during the internal auditor's presentation.

Resolution: President Dr. G.V. Basavaraja resolved that TDS-related queries will be addressed this year, and details of FIAP awardees, including their branches and states, will be incorporated into the annual report. All financial queries will be thoroughly addressed during the internal auditor's presentation.

11. Treasurer's Report and Advance Notice of Queries:

Discussion: Dr. Vijay Yewale proposed that all financial queries be addressed in the 'Treasurer's Report' and suggested that members submit their queries in advance to allow office bearers to prepare responses.

Resolution: President Dr. G.V. Basavaraja resolved that all financial queries will be addressed in the 'Treasurer's Report,' and members are encouraged to submit their queries in advance for thorough preparation.

12. NRP and ALS/BLS Programs:

Discussion: Dr. Sridevi Narayanan expressed concerns about the conduct of NRP and ALS/BLS programs, requesting that district branches be included in the allocation process.

Resolution: President Dr. G.V. Basavaraja resolved to include district branches in the allocation process for NRP and ALS/BLS programs to ensure equitable participation.

Agenda No. 6: Consideration and Adoption of Audited Statement of Accounts for the Year Ended 31st March 2023 and the Budget for the Year 2024-2025

President Dr. G.V. Basavaraja proceeded to agenda no.6 and invited Treasurer, Dr. Atanu Bhadra, to present the audited statement of accounts for the year ending 31st March 2023 and the budget for the year 2024-2025.

Dr. Atanu Bhadra began by expressing sincere thanks to the CIAP Office Bearers of 2023 and the Finance Committee for their support and contributions. Dr. Atanu Bhadra highlighted the following key issues:

1. The order received from the CGST and Central Excise Commissionerate on 29th November 2023, demanded a service tax of around Rs 9 crore. He clarified that this demand was waived off as of January 2024.
2. Financial Overview of funds, liabilities, corpus funds, income sources, expenses, property and assets, and fixed deposits of IAP.

Dr. Atanu Bhadra further presented the consolidated estimated budget for the year 2024-2025, which included:

1. The consolidated budget for 2024-2025 was detailed, covering all significant financial aspects.
2. Approval for the appointment of statutory and concurrent auditors.
3. TDS details from the years 2011 to 2023 were also reviewed.

Dr. Atanu Bhadra then requested Mr. Swapnesh Burad, the Internal Auditor, to share important milestones and processes. Mr. Swapnesh Burad provided a detailed explanation, including contributions from Pedicon events.

Discussions and Resolutions:

1. Sales Tax and TDS Issues:

Discussion: Dr. Samir Dalwai elaborated on Service tax and TDS issues, expressing gratitude for the members' support.

Resolution: The Chairperson resolved that the TDS issues will be thoroughly reviewed, and all relevant actions will be taken.

2. Budget and Presentation Queries:

Discussion: Dr. Bharat Agarwal raised queries regarding the budget presentation and suggested that all verified account details be reflected in the annual report.

Resolution: The Chairperson resolved that the finance committee would verify the accounts and ensure they are accurately reflected in the annual report.

3. Funds for Repairs and Renovations:

Discussion: Dr. Dhananjay Shah inquired about the funds earmarked for repairs and renovations.

Resolution: The Chairperson assured that the finance committee will review these funds and provide recommendations in the next meeting.

4. Pedicon Accounts Format:

Discussion: Dr. Mahavir Prasad Jain discussed the format for Pedicon accounts to be used by organizing host branches.

Resolution: The Chairperson resolved that a standardized format will be developed and implemented for all Pedicon accounts.

5. Research and Committee Formation:

Discussion: Dr. Neelam Mohan suggested increasing the allocation for research and forming a committee to explore options for multi-centric research.

Resolution: The General Body resolved to increase the allocation for research and establish a committee to explore research opportunities.

6. Pedicon Expenses Review:

Discussion: Dr. Pramod Kulkarni raised concerns about the need to review Pedicon expenses.

Resolution: The Chairperson assured that the finance committee will review all Pedicon-related expenses and submit a detailed report in the upcoming Executive Board meeting.

7. Telephone and Internet Costs:

Discussion: Dr. Vasudev raised queries regarding telephone and internet costs and proposed a financial review of taxes to be paid.

Resolution: The Chairperson assured that the finance committee will conduct the financial review of communication expenses and tax liabilities.

8. Garment Expenses:

Discussion: Dr. Ramesh Goyal inquired about the garment expenses incurred during the IPA Pedicon in Gandhinagar 2023.

Resolution: The Chairperson assured that the finance committee will be asked to scrutinize these expenses and submit a detailed report at the next Executive Board meeting.

9. Pedicon Financial Concerns:

Discussion: Dr. Santosh Soans, Past President of IAP 2018, and other members raised concerns regarding specific Pedicon expenses, such as hairstyling costs.

Resolution: The Chairperson assured that the finance committee will review these concerns and present their findings at the next meeting.

10. UG/PG Quiz Expenses:

Discussion: Dr. R. Somasekhar suggested revising the expenses related to the UG/PG Quiz, including travel and accommodation for quiz coordinators.

Resolution: The Chairperson assured that the quiz-related expenses will be reviewed, and necessary revisions will be made.

11. Tax Payment Liabilities:

Discussion: Dr. Ramesh Goyal and Dr. Vineet Tyagi discussed tax payment liabilities and sought clarification.

Resolution: The Chairperson assured that all tax-related queries will be addressed comprehensively during the internal auditor's presentation.

12. Charity and Child Rights:

Discussion: Dr. Rajeev Seth emphasized the need to form a committee focused on charity related to child rights.

Resolution: The Chairperson assured that the committee will be formed to address charity initiatives focused on child rights.

13. Faculty Registration and Refunds:

Discussion: Dr. Alok Gupta inquired about faculty registration at Pedicon and the possibility of refunds for early registrations.

Resolution: The Chairperson assured that the SOP committee will review the current policies and provide recommendations on faculty registration and refunds.

14. Treasurer's Continuity:

Discussion: Dr. Hemant Gangolia suggested that the treasurer from the previous year should attend the next meeting for more detailed financial insights.

Resolution: The Chairperson resolved that the previous year's treasurer would attend future General Body meetings for continuity.

15. IAP Website and Research Methodology:

Discussion: Dr. Hemant Joshi suggested making the IAP website, apps, and textbooks freely accessible to all members, while Dr A Yashowanth Rao recommended increased allocation for research methodology and thesis writing.

Resolution: The Chairperson assured that the access to IAP resources will be expanded, and additional funding will be allocated for research methodology initiatives.

16. Secretarial Assistance:

Discussion: The President informed the assembly about the provision of secretarial assistance to the Treasurer.

Resolution: After taking the views of all the members who were present, the General body unanimously resolved that secretarial assistance would be provided to the Treasurer and Editor in Chief of IJPP with immediate effect.

The audited statement of accounts for the year ending 31st March 2023 and the estimated budget for the year 2024-2025 were presented, thoroughly discussed, and approved. The resolutions were proposed by Dr. Santanu Deb and seconded by Dr. Nikhil Pathak and Dr. Hemant Joshi.

AGENDA NO. 7: APPOINTMENT OF AUDITORS AND FIXING THEIR REMUNERATION FOR 2024-2025

The President, Dr. G.V. Basavaraja, moved to Agenda No. 7, which involved the appointment of auditors and the determination of their remuneration for the fiscal year 2024-25. He informed the assembly that the Executive Board had recommended a payment of ₹ 1,20,000 per annum to Mr. Brahme and ₹ 65,000 quarterly to the internal auditor. This proposal was now presented to the General Body for approval.

Resolution:

The General Body resolved to approve the honorarium of ₹ 1,20,000 per annum for Mr. Brahme and ₹ 65,000 quarterly for the internal auditor. This resolution was proposed by Dr. Hemant Joshi and seconded by Dr. Archana Joshi.

AGENDA NO. 8: APPOINTMENT OF HONORARY LEGAL ADVISOR FOR 2024-2025

President Dr. G.V. Basavaraja then informed the assembly that the Executive Board has proposed an early bird registration fee of ₹ 13,000/- until 31st March 2024, for the General Body's consideration and adoption.

Discussions:

1. **Dr. Alok Bhandari** raised concerns about the missing details of spouses of IAP members. Dr. G.V. Basavaraja requested Dr. M. Surendranath to include these details separately in the registration materials.
2. **Dr. Srinivas** inquired about the age criteria for senior citizens. Dr. G.V. Basavaraja clarified that, as per the IAP constitution, senior citizens are defined as 65 years and above; however, for Pedicon purposes, the age is set at 70 years and above. This criterion will be mentioned clearly in the registration materials.
3. **Dr. Ramakant Patil** expressed concerns about the early bird registration fee and requested exploring a graded registration fee. **Dr. Anjali Gokarn** suggested having two slabs for senior citizens, which Dr. G.V. Basavaraja agreed to look into the suggestion given.
4. **Dr. Nikhil Pathak** proposed lowering the early bird registration fee to Rs. 11,000/- or less, arguing that Hyderabad could generate more revenue compared to Kochi.
5. **Dr. Ajoy Kumar** shared his experience from previous national conferences in Hyderabad, noting that registration fees contribute significantly to the Pedicon budget. He advised using the term "balance after expenses" instead of "profit" to avoid income tax issues and suggested an early bird registration fee of Rs. 13,000/-. Dr. G.V. Basavaraja responded positively to this suggestion and acknowledged the details shared by Dr. Kumar.
6. **Dr. Hemant Gangolia** supported Dr. Nikhil Pathak's suggestions and further recommended clarity on the age of children and accompanying persons.
7. **Dr. Hemant Joshi** raised concerns about the significant difference between early bird and spot registration fees. He suggested providing seed money from the previous National IAP share to the next Pedicon organizing team.
8. **Dr. Jeetendra Gavhane** suggested considering registration fees for all categories, including PG students and proposed extending the early bird registration period by one month. Dr. G.V. Basavaraja appreciated this suggestion and agreed to explore it.
9. **Dr. M.S. Viswanathan** suggested lowering the registration fees for accompanying guests and extending the early bird registration period until the end of February. Dr. G.V. Basavaraja acknowledged this input and agreed to consider it.
10. **Dr. Ramakant Patil** reiterated the importance of setting the early bird registration fee to less than Rs. 10,000/-, noting that Hyderabad has a higher revenue potential compared to Kochi. He suggested an early bird registration fee of Rs. 11,000/- or Rs. 12,000/-.
11. **Dr. A Yashowanth Rao** provided details on the estimated budget for Pedicon 2025 at Hyderabad and recommended setting the early bird registration fee at Rs. 13,000/- to cover costs effectively.
12. **Dr. Kesavulu** invited everyone to Pedicon 2025 and supported extending the early bird registration until February 2024.
13. **Dr. Bela Verma** requested reducing registration fees for PG students to account for travel and accommodation expenses.
14. **Dr. Ramesh Dampuri** suggested that the audit report should reflect "excess of income over expenditure" rather than "profit."
15. **Dr. Guruprasad** proposed that the registration fees for accompanying persons should be half of those for IAP members and that PG students attending for a few days should be eligible for the early bird registration slab.
16. **Dr. Srinivas** proposed setting the early bird registration fee at Rs. 12,500/- with a deadline of 31st March 2024. Dr. G.V. Basavaraja considered this proposal in the final decision.
17. **Dr. Annamalai Vijayaraghavan** raised concerns about the registration fees for accompanying persons and non-IAP members and suggested issuing certificates of credit hours to doctors.

18. **Dr. Neeli Ramchander** supported the early bird registration fee of Rs. 13,000/- and highlighted the need for clear communication regarding registration details.
19. **Dr. Alok Bhandari** emphasized the need for clarity on the age of senior citizens and stated that all PG students must be IAP members. Dr. G.V. Basavaraja confirmed that the age would be counted as of 1st January.

Resolution:

After considering all suggestions and discussions, Dr. G.V. Basavaraja proposed:

1. **Early bird registration fee:** Rs. 12,500/- including GST, valid until 31st March 2024, with subsequent slabs of Rs. 5,000/- increments.
2. **Accompanying persons' fees:** Same as that of delegates.
3. **PG students' registration fee:** Rs. 9,000/- until September 2024, with an increase of Rs. 2,000/- thereafter until the conference.
4. **Senior citizens:** Early bird registration slab will apply until September 2024, with the age criterion set at 70 years and above as of 1st January.

These proposals were passed unanimously.

AGENDA NO 11: ANY OTHER BUSINESS (NOTICE CIRCULATED WITH THE AGENDA)

The President, Dr. G.V. Basavaraja, moved to Agenda No. 11 and opened the floor for discussion on any other business matters. The following discussions took place:

1. Status of IJPP Suggestions and Constitution Modifications:

- a) **Inquiry on IJPP Suggestions:** Dr. Nedunchelian inquired about the current status of the Indian Journal of Practical Pediatric's suggestions to change the constitution clauses concerning office bearers positions as existed before CRC 2023 amendments.
- b) **Constitution Modifications:** Dr. Gowrishankar requested details regarding any communications with ordinary IAP members about changes or modifications in the constitution.

Discussion:

The President Dr.G.V.Basavaraja provided a detailed background on these issues, noting that they had been thoroughly discussed in previous meetings. He then invited the immediate past president, Dr. Upendra Kinjawadekar, to further clarify the situation.

Dr. Upendra Kinjawadekar informed the assembly of the processes undertaken, including communications related to these matters, particularly highlighting the Special General Body (SGM) meeting held in Navi Mumbai on 7th May 2023.

2. Concerns Regarding Degradation of Posts and Removal of Secretarial Assistance:

Dr. T.L. Ratna Kumari expressed concerns about the degradation of certain posts and the removal of secretarial assistance, as noted in the annual report.

The President acknowledged these concerns and assured the members that these issues would be brought up for discussion in the next Constitution Review Committee meeting.

3. Proposal to Restore Secretarial Assistance to IJPP:

Dr. A Yashowanth Rao proposed the immediate restoration of secretarial assistance to IJPP. The proposal was seconded by Dr. Dararu Rangnath.

The General Body resolved to restore secretarial assistance to IJPP with immediate effect.

Resolution:-

- 1) Concerns expressed by the honorable members regarding the office bearers position for the Editor in Chief of IP and IJPP will be brought to the notice of next CRC committee.

AGENDA NO 12: ANY OTHER BUSINESS OF WHICH 30 DAYS' NOTICE HAS BEEN GIVEN TO THE SECRETARY GENERAL IN WRITING.

The President, Dr. G.V. Basavaraja, moved to Agenda No. 12. However, no discussions took place under this agenda item as no notice had been provided to the Secretary General.

Dr. Vijay Raghavan asked if it would be possible to record all conferences and make these recordings available for purchase to members. The President responded affirmatively.

With no further points for discussion, the meeting was concluded. Treasurer Dr. Atanu Bhadra extended a vote of thanks, followed by the National Anthem sung by all.

Action Taken Report on Resolutions from the Annual General Body Meeting held in Kochi, January 2024**Agenda No. 1: Welcome Note and Introduction of Executive Board Members 2024**

1. The IAP Office Bearers have been duly addressed as per the MoA in all official documents and Executive Board members have been appropriately labeled with their respective state affiliations.

Agenda No. 4: Business arising out of the previous General Body Meeting minutes.

2. Standard Operating Procedures have been framed in the IAP Rule Book for conducting the Annual General Body Meeting, along with other procedural standards for the day-to-day affairs of the Society, all in alignment with the MoA.
3. Regarding the sale of the Kailash Darshan property, the matter was discussed in detail by the Finance Committee. Following their advice, a newly formed Building Committee, responsible for overseeing the Society's property and immovable assets, consulted with the chartered accountant and held thorough discussions. The Committee concluded that there is no urgent need to sell the Kailash Darshan property at this time, as IAP is not incurring any losses by retaining it. Additionally, the Society has sufficient funds to acquire any new properties. As a result, the proposal to sell the property has been dropped for now.
4. We acknowledge the delay due to administrative reasons, in sharing the minutes of the Annual General Body Meeting within the promised 30 days. We sincerely regret this. We aimed to act on all resolutions, implement SOPs, reform financial affairs, and work towards achieving the Society's objectives, which contributed to the delay.

Agenda No. 5: Consideration and Adoption of Annual Report of The Society

5. Steps have been taken as per the IAP Rule Book, to share all the important committee reports with the members.
6. The date for the Complementary Feeding Day has been corrected.
7. The Annual Financial Report was presented to the members in accordance with the resolutions passed by including detailed financial information, including ITR filings, TDS status, income tax demands, and updates on ongoing tax cases.
8. The Finance Committee has scrutinized the accounts of Noida Pedicon 2022 and requested clarifications from the Noida Pedicon Organising Committee. Discussions regarding the matter is going on.
9. In addition, the Finance Committee scrutinized the accounts of Hyderabad Pedicon 2016 and sought clarifications from the Hyderabad Branch. Discussions regarding the matter is going on.
10. As resolved in the previous meeting, the IAP Presidential Action Plan 2024 successfully organized 18 scientific module workshops. Most modules conducted over 25 workshops each, except the 'Tiny to Tall' Module, where a key academic partner withdrew, resulting in only 10 workshops being conducted.
11. All the request for mannequins have been addressed.

12. All mentioned bank accounts are functioning and belong to IAP, IP, and IJPP offices, one account has been closed and all the remaining accounts are actively functional. Two IPA congress accounts will be closed soon.
13. Details of branch awards given are listed in the annual report, and it is now a rule to continue this reporting in future annual reports of the Society.
14. Medicolegal Celebration Day was successfully held.
15. IT demand notice and TDS-related queries were discussed in detail by the Finance Committee, with the Chartered Accountant providing advice. The possibility of applying a petition with the CBDT, filing a case in the High Court, or paying 20% of the IT demand under protest was considered. Our Chartered Accountant advised against these actions to avoid confrontation with IT officials but he has agreed himself to consult with High Court advocates regarding filing the case in the High Court. We are awaiting their response as of October 31st, 2024.
16. We have taken steps to invite queries regarding the Annual Financial Report by the Treasurer. However, in the democratic process of administration, we cannot prevent any member from raising concerns during the AGBM.

Agenda No. 6: Consideration and Adoption of Audited Statement of Accounts for the Year Ended 31st March 2023 and the Budget for the Year 2024-2025

17. The IAP Rule Book Committee has prescribed “Standards of Procedures” for all financial activities of IAP.
18. The Finance Committee has thoroughly scrutinized IAP accounts, ensuring that earmarked funds for repairs and renovations are accurately reflected in the annual report.
19. No action could be taken toward creating a standardized format for Pedicon accounts, as each Pedicon is audited by different auditors who follow their reporting methods in line with generally accepted accounting principles.
20. Funds earmarked for academics, research, endowment, and awards have been enhanced in accordance with the resolutions made.
21. As mentioned earlier, all Pedicon-related expenses are under ongoing scrutiny by the Finance Committee.
22. The grant for the IAP UG-PG Quiz has been increased based on the recommendations of the IAP Rule Book Committee.





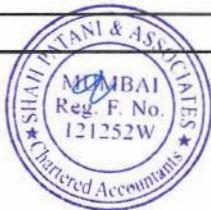

6. To provide facilities to members, students, and institutions for the study of or research in Pediatrics in any of its aspects by way of scholarships, fellowships, grants, endowments, etc...
7. To establish, maintain, or award fellowships, prizes, certificates, and diplomas of proficiency in the science of Pediatrics, and conduct professional tests, examinations, or other scrutiny as may be prescribed from time to time, either independently or in collaboration with other bodies.
8. To print and publish official Journals of the Society, books, periodicals, or publications on Pediatrics and allied subjects which the Society thinks desirable for the promotion of its aims and objectives.
9. To organize Conferences, Lectures, Meetings, Seminars, CMEs, Exhibitions, and Training programs by physical and/or digital platforms, for the promotion of its aims and objectives.
10. To facilitate the formation of Branches I Sub-Specialty Chapters of the Society for promoting all or any of the aims and objectives of the Society.
11. To assist the Government and Public Health Institutions in the formulation and implementation of Child Health Policies.
12. To cooperate, affiliate with other professional bodies and engage in such other forms of activities as may be decided upon by the Society from time to time to accomplish the aims and objectives of the Society.
13. To formulate and provide guidelines/criteria for accreditation, examinations and curriculum for various Courses/ Fellowship Programs and any other academic activities by its Subspecialty Chapters and affiliated/authorized institutions.
14. To start the social welfare schemes for members and their families at large.
15. To provide healthcare to underprivileged and differently-abled children through any of its Branches and Subspecialty Chapters and its Members.
16. To carry out any such charitable activities to help society, especially underprivileged and differently-abled children, victims of natural/man-made disasters/pandemics directly or through the Government and/or NGO.
17. To help by any means families of Armed forces of the country during war or peace for child healthcare.
18. To conduct and take actions as may be necessary to the attainment of the above aims and objectives or any of them.
